Medicaid Allowable HS Code	Population	Description of Coding According to Standards and Guidelines
3101	Prenatal, Infants, & Children	<u>Needs Tracking Only</u> - This initial contact outcome code is used when the initial contact indicates that a time sensitive (within 10 days) initial assessment is unnecessary and the participant can be funneled directly into care coordination. Tracking may be face-to-face or not face-to-face.
3102	Prenatal, Infants, & Children	<u>Enrollee Needs Assessment</u> - This initial contact outcome code is used when the initial contact results in a determination that the participant needs or desires a time-sensitive (within 10 days) face-to-face assessment.
3110	Prenatal, Infants, & Children	<u>Declines Services</u> - This initial contact outcome code is used when the participant verbally declines additional services after the initial contact service has been provided, even though the care coordinator believes further services are warranted. Code 3110 indicates that an initial contact has been completed and all criteria outlined for providing the initial contact have been met. Follow-up is discontinued.
3111	Prenatal, Infants, & Children	<u>No Further Services Needed</u> - This initial contact outcome code is used when the participant and the care coordination provider collaboratively agree that no further services are needed. Code 3111 indicates that an initial contact has been completed and all criteria outlined for providing the initial contact have been met. Follow-up is discontinued.
3113	Prenatal, Infants, & Children	<u>Receiving or will Receive Care Coordination from another Provider, Not CMS/Early Steps</u> - This initial contact outcome code is used when the care coordination is (or will be) adequately provided by another provider, but not CMS/Early Steps. Code 3113 indicates that an initial contact has been completed and all criteria outlined for providing the initial contact have been met. Follow-up is discontinued.
3201	Prenatal, Infants, & Children	<u>Needs Tracking Only</u> - This initial assessment outcome code is used when the participant needs less intensive care coordination services.
3202	Prenatal, Infants, & Children	<u>Plan Ongoing Care Coordination</u> - This initial assessment outcome code is used when the initial assessment results in a determination that the participant needs more follow-up than would be provided by tracking alone.
3210	Prenatal, Infants, & Children	<u>Declines Services</u> - This initial assessment outcome code is used when the participant verbally declines additional services <u>after</u> the initial assessment service has been provided, even though the care coordination provider believes further services are warranted. Code 3210 indicates that an initial assessment has been completed and all criteria outlined for providing the initial assessment have been met.
3211	Prenatal, Infants, & Children	<u>No Further Services Needed</u> - This initial assessment outcome code is used when the participant and the care coordination provider collaboratively agree that no further services are needed. Code 3211 indicates that an initial assessment has been completed and all criteria outlined for providing the initial assessment have been met.
3213	Prenatal, Infants, & Children	<u>Receiving or will Receive Care Coordination from another Provider, Not CMS/Early Steps</u> - This initial assessment outcome code is used when the care coordination is (or will be) adequately provided by another source, not CMS/Early Steps. Code 3213 indicates that an initial assessment has been completed and all criteria outlined for providing the initial assessment have been met.
3310	Infants & Children	<u>Declines Services</u> - This ongoing care coordination outcome code is used when the participant verbally declines or refuses services, in spite of the fact that the care coordination provider believes services are warranted. Code 3310 indicates that you have provided an ongoing care coordination service and that the participant has refused to continue ongoing care coordination.
3311	Infants & Children	<u>No Further Services Needed</u> - This ongoing care coordination outcome code is used when the participant and the care coordination provider collaboratively agree that no further services are

		needed.
3313	Infants & Children	<u>Receiving Care Coordination from Another Provider, not CMS/Early Steps</u> - This ongoing care coordination outcome code is used when the ongoing care coordination is (or will be) adequately provided by another provider, not CMS/Early Steps.
3320	Prenatal, Infants, & Children	<u>Care Coordination Face-to-face</u> - This ongoing care coordination code is used when care coordination activity is provided face-to-face with the participant.
3321	Prenatal, Infants, & Children	<u>Care Coordination Tracking or Not Face-to-face</u> - Use this ongoing care coordination code when providing tracking activities either face-to-face or not face-to-face, or when providing ongoing care coordination that is not face-to-face.
3322	Prenatal, Infants, & Children	<u>Initial Family Support Plan Meeting</u> - This ongoing care coordination code is used at the time that the family support plan is written (face-to-face). A family support plan is required for all level 3 participants.
3323	Prenatal, Infants, & Children	<u>Update Family Support Plan</u> - This ongoing care coordination code is used when the family support plan is updated (face-to-face). Minimally, this should be done every three months. Use only for updating a family support plan of a level 3 participant.
4501	Prenatal, Infants, & Children	<u>Nutrition Assessment/Counseling</u> - This service entails providing face-to-face intensive therapeutic nutrition assessment and counseling to the at-risk Healthy Start pregnant woman or family/caregiver of the at-risk Healthy Start child.
8004	Prenatal, Infants, & Children	<u>Parenting Education and Support</u> - This service entails providing face-to-face activities that educate and inform the family and parents/caregivers about care of the newborn, infant, and older child.
8006	Prenatal, Infants, & Children	<u>Childbirth Education</u> - This service entails providing face-to-face activities that inform and educate the pregnant woman and her family, both during early and late pregnancy, and promote healthy outcomes for the woman and her infant.
8008	Prenatal, Infants, & Children	<u>Breastfeeding Education & Support</u> - This service entails providing comprehensive information, education, and counseling to prenatal and postpartum participants or to the Healthy Start infant's mother, including assistance in overcoming barriers to breastfeeding, postpartum hospital and home visits, encouraging the initiation of breastfeeding, and providing anticipatory guidance and support in order to prevent breastfeeding problems.
8026	Prenatal, Infants, & Children	<u>Tobacco Education and Cessation Counseling</u> - This service entails providing comprehensive information, education, reinforcement, and support throughout pregnancy and postpartum to participants, parents/caregivers of Healthy Start children, their families, and other household members related to the importance of tobacco cessation for both maternal and child health.
